The overall objectives of WP4 'Empowering online media' include:

- Building the capacities of professionals working for online media in identifying and dealing with cases of gender-based hate speech
- Introducing a comprehensive practical mechanism to online media countering gender-based online hate speech, combining the ICT tool and relevant procedures

T4.3 Drafting, signature and promotion of Code of Conduct for online media platforms on combating online gender based violence and promotion for EU level mainstreaming

A **Code of Conduct website** was also created by CSI, promoting the Code and process for receiving e-badges for alignment, promoting the Code signatories, and enabling new actors to sign. The website makes freely available the capacity building/training programme for media personnel and professionals in EN, FR, GR to allow replication/transfer. Furthermore, the Code of Conduct will be promoted by the partnership (through targeted campaigns/events see WP5 (T5.3 & 5.5), and through the partners own networks & tools) for mainstreaming at EU level, for example to the European Federation of Journalists (and Digital Expert Group) or for incorporation/addition to the Code of Conduct on Countering Illegal Hate Speech Online (which neither extends to gender-based hate speech nor other types of gender-based cyber violence).

Introduction:

The Code of Conduct website functions as a central information hub and e-badge access point for interested individuals, members and media organisations. Its primary objective is to promote the Code of Conduct and guide users through the process of obtaining the CHASE-designed e-badge via a series of mandatory steps. 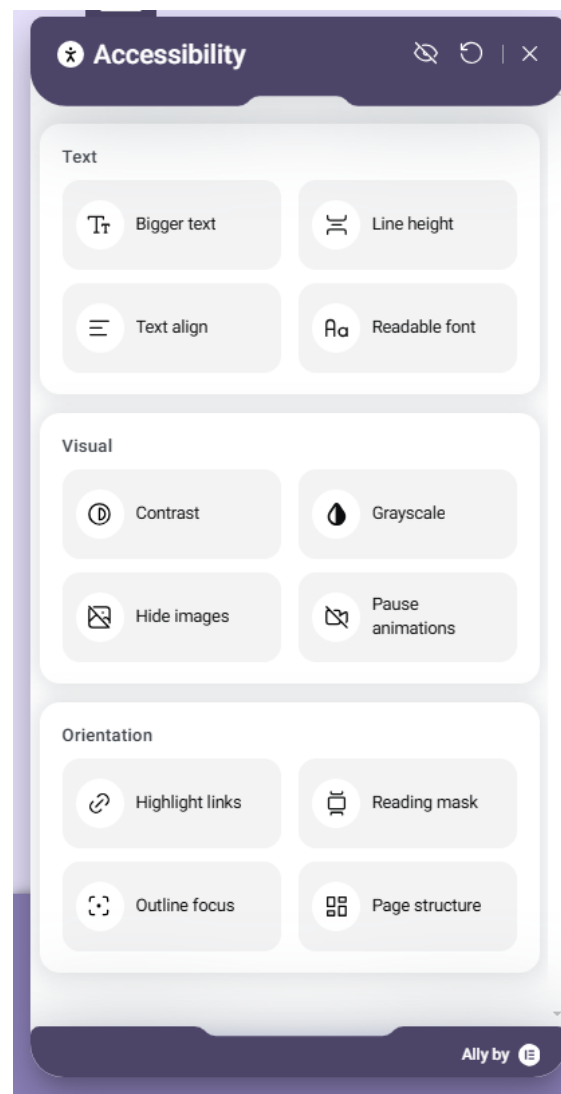
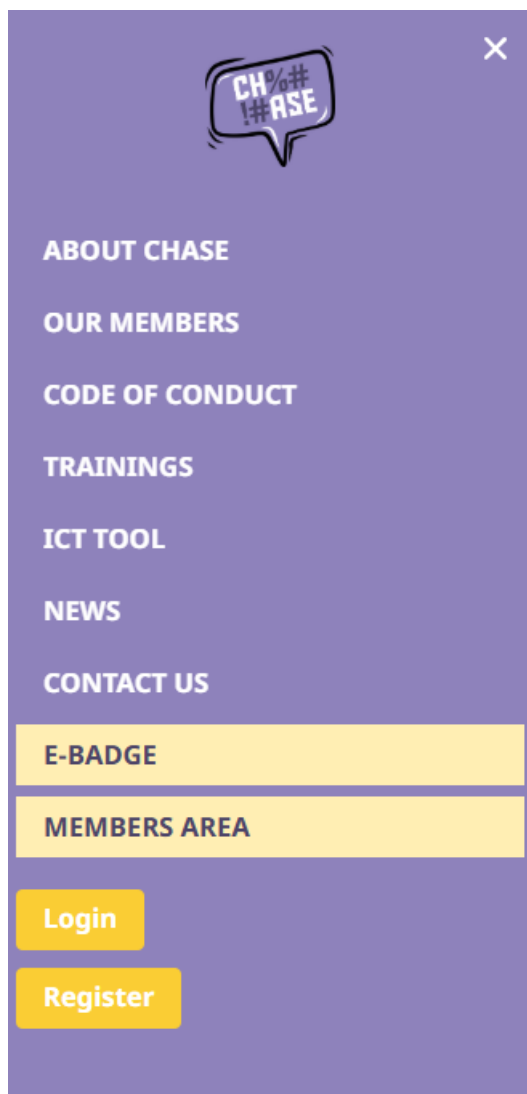
Navigation bar

Code of Conduct

This section promotes the Code of Conduct and its signatories while enabling new users to join through a user-friendly navigation and registration process. It provides access to the full Code of Conduct, along with the set of principles used to monitor compliance. Once these documents have been read, understood and accepted, users can proceed to formally sign the Code. Following that, users must complete the online questionnaire, in order to gain the e-badge. The embedded questionnaire focuses on the policies and ethical practices followed by each media organisation. It serves as an additional validation step prior to the awarding of the e-badge.

The CHASE Code of Conduct provides a common, human-rights-based framework to support media organisations and other relevant stakeholders in preventing and addressing online gender-based violence. The Code establishes shared standards, responsibilities and safeguards for responsible online content production and moderation. By promoting transparency, accountability, and alignment with EU-level legal and ethical standards, the Code aims to strengthen trust, encourage voluntary commitment and contribute to safer, more inclusive digital environments across Europe.

The CHASE Set of Principles for Monitoring Code Compliance establishes a structured and transparent framework for the annual assessment of media organisations' adherence to the CHASE Code of Conduct. Building on a human-rights-based and gender-sensitive approach, the framework defines clear principles, domains and indicators to support consistent, evidence-based monitoring across participating countries. By combining independent civil society oversight with harmonised evaluation standards, the monitoring framework promotes accountability, continuous improvement and EU-level mainstreaming of responsible media practices, contributing to the effective prevention of online gender-based violence.

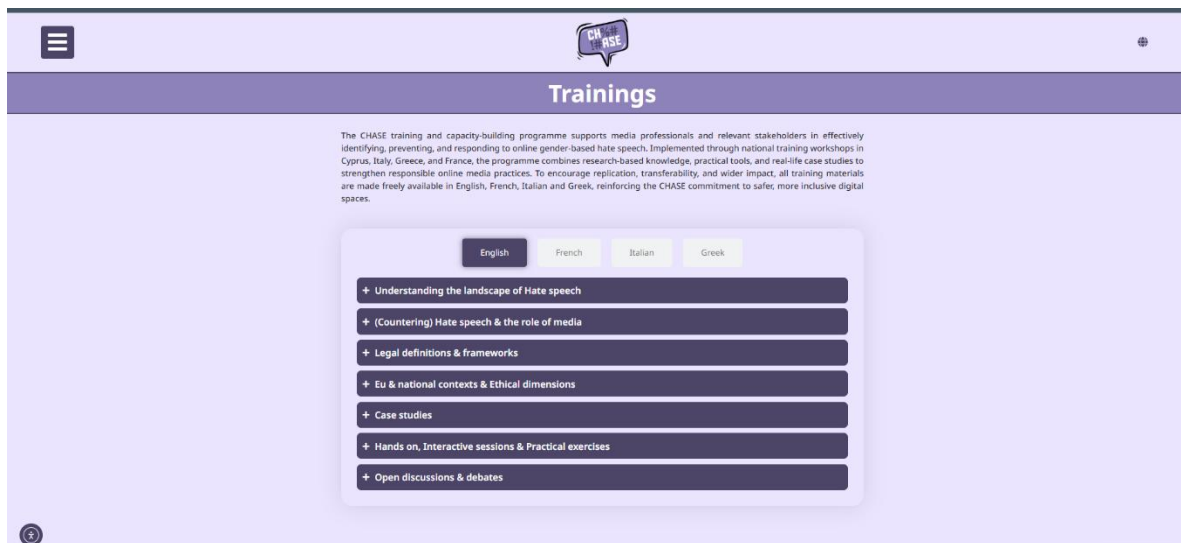
Trainings

This section includes the training materials developed in the framework of the Train-the-Trainers and national training sessions implemented in partner countries. The content is categorised and presented in a way that facilitates replication and transferability to media personnel and professionals.

The thematic areas and materials are derived from the CHASE trainings as a whole and are structured to be easily adapted and reused by other organisations delivering similar capacity-building initiatives. The content adopts a holistic approach, covering all key thematic areas addressed by the CHASE project, including:

- Social understanding - the context, dynamics, and landscape of hate speech, Countering hate speech and the role of the media,
- Legal understanding - legal definitions and frameworks at EU and national levels, as well as ethical dimensions,
- Case studies & hands-on, interactive sessions – practical exercises, open discussions and debates highlighting their role and importance in effective training delivery.

The capacity-building and training programme for media personnel and professionals is made freely available through the website in Greek, French, and Italian, with the aim of enhancing replication and transferability.





Trainings

The CHASE training and capacity-building programme supports media professionals and relevant stakeholders in effectively identifying, preventing, and responding to online gender-based hate speech. Implemented through national training workshops in Cyprus, Italy, Greece, and France, the programme combines research-based knowledge, practical tools, and real-life case studies to strengthen responsible online media practices. To encourage replication, transferability, and wider impact, all training materials are made freely available in English, French, and Greek, reinforcing the CHASE commitment to safer, more inclusive digital spaces.

Case studies form a central pillar of the training programme, enabling participants to translate theoretical knowledge into applied media practice. This thematic area uses realistic examples of media content, online comments and digital interactions that may constitute hate speech or gender-based hate speech.

Participants analyse multiple scenarios, assessing context, intent, impact and audience reach. They are tasked with making editorial and moderation decisions, such as whether content should be published, contextualised, restricted or removed. The case studies highlight ambiguity, indirect and ironic hate speech and the challenges of borderline cases, reinforcing the need for clear guidelines, reflective judgement and shared professional standards.

This thematic area emphasises practical learning through interactive and participatory methodologies. Participants engage in hands-on exercises designed to strengthen their ability to identify, assess, and respond to online hate speech in real-world media settings.

Activities include moderation simulations, group-based analysis, reflective discussions, and applied use of analytical frameworks. Participants are introduced to the CHASE comprehensive mechanism and receive detailed training on the CHASE ICT Moderation Tool, focusing on its functionalities, analytical features, and practical use in newsroom and media environments. The module reinforces the role of technology as a supportive decision-making aid that complements human judgement and ethical responsibility.

Open discussions and debates are integrated throughout the training programme to promote critical thinking, peer learning and the exchange of diverse perspectives. This thematic area provides structured spaces for participants to reflect on professional challenges, ethical tensions and personal responses to online hate speech.

Participants engage in facilitated dialogue on topics such as freedom of expression, moderation responsibilities, emotional labour in media work and responses to gender-based and identity-based hate. The learning pathway concludes with collective reflection and the development of shared principles, including reference to the CHASE Code of Conduct, supporting the adoption of ethical, inclusive and transferable media practices across different professional contexts.

E-badge

This section outlines the steps and processes required to obtain the e-badge in relation to compliance with the Code of Conduct. The process includes creating an account, formally agreeing to the Code of Conduct, signing the Code and completing a mandatory questionnaire (Code of Conduct section-page 8). The questionnaire links redirects users to the dedicated Code of Conduct page. All steps are essential for assessing compliance with the Code, monitoring adherence to its principles and ensuring consideration of ethical standards in online environments. Once all required steps in the Code of Conduct section are completed, users return to the e-badge section and follow the outlined steps to display the CHASE e-badge on their website.
